LAUNCH OF THE 5TH SADC YOUTH FORUM THEME: "ACCELERATING REGIONAL INTEGRATION AND YOUTH PARTICIPATION IN AFCFTA". GABORONE, BOTSWANA

Media Houses from SADC and beyond, young people, our partners; its our pleasure to issue this statement on the 5th SADC Youth Forum.

We have gathered here to share information with the media about the 5th SADC Youth Forum which is an annual event hosted before the SADC Heads of States and Government Summit to deliberate on critical issues affecting young people in the region and proffer solutions in line with Development Strategies formulated by SADC and the Africa Union among other key institutions. The Forum is one of the largest youths gathering in Southern Africa convened by Southern Africa Youth Forum (SAYoF).

The Southern Africa Youth Forum (SAYoF) is a regional development platform for youth in the SADC region (16 member countries), and works with SADC Secretariat, SADC-PF, SADC-CNGO, African Union Youth Division, national governments, and SAT among other regional organizations to empower young people and ensure sustainable inclusion in developmental processes. SAYoF is the official convener of the SADC Youth Forum the largest youth gathering in Southern Africa convened before the SADC Heads of State and Government Summit to cocreate solutions for youth and ensure regional and national development that is youth-centered. SAYoF is the convener of SADC Youth Parliament a regional policy advocacy, engagement arm, and leadership mentorship flagship program for SAYoF which have Members of Parliament from across 16 Member countries. SAYoFsits in the Global Coalition for Youth, Peace, and Security, a UN-CSOs partnership to advance youth for peace, SAYoF sits in the Dengue Advisory Group an international committee to fight Dengue a Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTDs) and was appointed



by Africa Union (AU) to be part of the Africa Youth Front on Covid-19 a high-level policy and advocacy framework by the Africa Union (AU) Youth Envoy for young people to co-lead Africa's response to Covid-19. SAYoF is a Co-Convener for African Youth Commission on AfCFTA and represents Africa in the CPDE Youth Sector.

Taking note of the achievements realized since the first SADC Youth Forum in Tanzania, 2nd SADC Youth Forum in Mozambique and the 3rd SADC Youth Forum in Malawi and the 4th SADC Youth Forum in South Africa, we continue to place young people at the center of regional and national development.

Realizing that participation of young people as stakeholders and change makers as highlighted in the Youth Development Model remain a corner stone for effective development and youth empowerment. The past four years has seen the Forum reaching more than 1,000 000 young people in the 16 SADC Member States virtually and in-person for a common cause, creating a strong voice and representation for the SADC Youth.

Noting that SAYoF's work has been honored by several regional and international institutions on its capacity to push the youth development agenda. These include the selection of SAYoF by Africans Rising as one of the top ten Africa Youth Movements for 2020, appointment to sit in the Dengue Advisory Group, an international body focused on Neglected Tropical Diseases, SAYoF sits in the Global Coalition for Youth, Peace, and Security; UN-CSO partnership to advance youth for peace, SAYoF sits in the Steering Committee for Network for Religious and Traditional Peace Makers, SAYoF won Youth Engagement Award under International Society for Neglected Tropical Diseases (ISNTD) United Kingdom (2022), SAYoF won Youth Organization of the year Award (Think Big Experts) 2022 and recently selected to host the first Regional Conference of Youth (RCOY 28) event in the Southern Africa before the COP 28.

The 5th SADC Youth Forum will run under the theme, "Accelerating Regional Integration and Youth Participation in AfCFTA". The theme has been influenced by the Aspirations of the Regional Indicative Strategic Plan (RISDP) for SADC and the African Union theme of this year which is "Acceleration of AfCFTA Implementation" and the call by AfCFTA secretariat call for effective youth participation in AfCFTA. Effective participation of young people in AfCFTA implementation remains an important element for its success, hence, this year's forum seeks to accentuate the important role of youth in regional economic integration in Africa.

The 5th SADC Youth Forum will be a hybrid event, to allow broader participation of young people, targeting about 80 to 100 participants in person and 5000 others joining on SAYoF and



partners' online live platforms. The Forum is expected to have a total online reach of about 1,500 000 through live virtual hubs across the region and various social media platforms.

The 5th SADC Youth Forum will be graced by youth representatives from 16 SADC countries and communities, key stakeholders: Government representatives, SADC Secretariat, SADC-PF, African Union, AU Youth Division, Representatives of National Youth Councils, Youth Organizations, Students, Youth from marginalized communities, the Media, Religious groups, international and regional institutions.

The Objectives of the 5th SADC Youth Forum

- To provide a policy platform, and proffer youth oriented-action plans and initiatives that ensure effective youth participation at national and regional levels.
- To formulate AfCFTA Youth Implementation Strategy for the region.
- Receive updates and presentations on progress on AfCFTA, GCM acceleration, RISDP, SADC Youth Protocol among other initiatives to inform youth interventions for SAYoF Clusters, Stakeholders, and young people in the region.
- Take stock of previous forum outcomes, progress, challenges, and recommendations.
- Formulate a youth position on key policy issues to be submitted to the SADC Heads of State and Government, National, Regional and International Institutions in form of a Declaration.

The expected outcomes of the 5th SADC Youth Forum are:

1. AfCFTA Youth Implementation Strategy for the region.

2. 5th SADC Youth Forum Declaration and recommendation to be submitted to SADC

Member states and stakeholders in the region.

3. Thematic Position Papers or Call for Actions on the theme of the year.

The 5th SADC Youth Forum will be guided by SAYoF Clusters, covering the following sessions but not limited to:

1. Business, Innovation & Entrepreneurship

Session Topics:

- I. Harnessing innovation and research to drive the development of new products and services that are essential for the success of AfCFTA.
- II. Supporting youth-owned businesses in realization of the AfCFTA.



III. The importance of trade policy coherence and coordination among SADC Member States in implementing the AfCFTA.
