THE REGIONAL CONFERENCE OF YOUTH (RCOY) SCORED BIG AT THE 5TH SADC YOUTH FORUM

Climate Change has emerged as the apartheid of our time, wreaking havoc on planet Earth and leaving a lot to be desired. The crisis has resulted in several induced disasters chief amongst these being food insecurity, water scarcity, biodiversity loss. forced migration, and loss of sources of livelihoods amongst other calamities. All the aforementioned directly impact young people as the economically active age group particularly in the South who have least global contributed to it but get to bear the brunt of the crisis.

It is based on these uncertainties that the Southern Africa Youth Forum (SAYoF) and its partner organizations under the office of the Southern Africa Climate Youth Envoy and Environment and Climate Change Cluster organized

and hosted the first-ever Southern Africa Regional Conference on Youth (R-COY) 2023 to deliberate on critical climate issues affecting young people in the region, inspired by climate activists who are successfully advancing the agenda in the region. This conference, held in collaboration with YOUNGO under the UNFCCC Process brought together young leaders from the region to strategize and discuss issues related to the urgent need to address climate change and ensure environmental sustainability in advance of the 28th Conference of the Parties (COP28) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and the Africa Climate Week.

The Regional Conference of Youth (RCOY) noted that Climate change is not a distant issue, it is heavily impacting our

different communities and hence there is a dire need for young people to collaborate to address the crisis. Young called for continued people also commitments to support stronger climate actions toward implementing policies on environmental sustainability, land-based climate financing. investments. and governance. The participants at the acknowledged the work being done by the Southern Africa Climate Change Youth Envoy Ms. Laurel J. Kivuyo an office that came as a recommendation of the 4th SADC Youth Forum hosted in Johannesburg South Africa. proposed by the representative of the Government of South Africa Minister International Deputy of Relations and Cooperation Honourable Alvin Botes. The recommendations from RCOY have been summarized in the 5th SADC Youth Forum Declaration.

Katlego Nawa, SADC Youth Parliamentarian, who was also the Head of the 5th SADC Youth Forum Committee. Planning The official unveiling comes after SAYoF called for flag design submissions. "We opened a call for youth designers to submit their innovation, we appreciate the great talent, the meaning around the flag, and the youth aspiration as defined in the Youth Development Model. We are more excited to launch this flag, This flag must unite us, this flag must be a sign that youth would like to work with the elders using side-by-side concept to development, and this flag is a call to effective youth inclusion in policy and practice; this flag reminds us as youth

that they have the responsibility to develop their region, an integrated region, a benefit to Africa, and a prosperity for all" said Hon. Katlego Nawa at the unveiling.

The colors and symbols of the flag were defined as follows:

White: Peaceful co-existence among the young people and people in Southern Africa, Youth -entered Approach to Development, and Youth Primacy as defined in the Youth Development Model.

Red: The Pan-African Approach to development, the bloodshed during the liberation struggle, and the need to continue pursuing the struggle for youth empowerment, democracy, preservation of African heritage, territorial integrity, sovereignty, cooperation, effective

participation, youth power, inclusivity, and ownership of resources by young people.

Purple: The royalty of youth in the development of the Southern Africa region and Africa, youth as stakeholders, stockholders, changemakers, and leaders for transformation. Good fortune, and effective preservation of our natural resources such as minerals, and water bodies.

Triangle Shape: A symbol of equality, gender parity, egalitarian society, and the quest for fairness.

SAYoF Logo- (Circle) Unity in diversity, with all 16 SADC countries, different colors, one people, prosperity, everyone fits in the circle of love, and greatness.

EUROPEAN UNION PLEDGED ITS COMMITMENT TO REGIONAL INTEGRATION AND YOUTH PARTICIPATION IN AFCETA.

The European Union delegation to Botswana and SADC represented by the Deputy Head of Mission, Ms. Silvia Hamrouni Bopp during the Official Opening of the 5th SADC Youth Forum pledged its commitment to Regional Integration and Youth Participation in AfCFTA through its support to SADC regional economic integration programmes. The Team Europe Technical Assistance Facility to the African Free Trade Area will support the women and youth protocol of the AfCFTA agreement with the objective of addressing inequalities of these vulnerable groups in taking advantage of trade opportunities Speaking at the opening session Ms. Silvia noted that the EU's work for empowering young people in the region is visible in their support to the Southern African Development Community (SADC) and the EU is working hand in hand with SADC on a wide range of issues directly affecting the present and the future of youths in the region. It includes programs on addressing mitigating climate change, conflict prevention,

and governance of sexual and reproductive health and rights. The EU is also supporting the development of trade in the region, industrialization, and a more conducive business environment through three programs called Support to Improving the Investment and the Business Environment (SIBE), the Support to Industrialisation and Productive Sectors (SIPS) and the Trade Facilitation Programme (EUR 48 million in total). Ms. Silvia noted that young people are key to achieving Sustainable Development Goals as the future of youths is put at risk by inequalities, climate change, and conflicts. Youths legitimately demand swifter and more courageous solutions to global challenges and want to be heard and involved.
